One of the most valuable contributions they could make to the solution of the problems of the shipowner and importer was to give a quick turn-round of ships. As to the scheme for the modernisation of existing docks, the first stage of that work had been put into operation at the Edinburgh Dock. Construction of jetties and navigation lights at the new East and West breakwaters would be put into hand as soon as possible.

Regarding nationalisation, Sir Gilbert said that along with many other Leith people his experience did not lead him to expect that control from Whitehall would bring in a new era of prosperity for Leith, or secure more efficient or economic management. ### THE ATLANTIC FERRY

U.S. Liner "America" on First Westbound Voyage

#### SOUTHAMPTON'S WELCOME

From Our Special Correspondent SOUTHAMPTON, Saturday

America arrived here from Havre this afternoon in the course of her first westbound voyage as a transatlantic passenger liner. She was due to sail at 6 30 p.m. this evening, but her departure was delayed by weather. Commenting on the high run, from New York to Cobh (24.4 knots), the master, Commodore Henry Manning, pointed out that she would be unlikely to make such a good passage back, since conditions were never so favourable from east to west. Her chief engineer, Mr. Patrick Brennan. told me previously that on the eastward run the engines had still had a reserve of power. The America is sail-

ing with a full passenger list.

A pleasant gesture of greeting was made to the America shortly after she had passed the Nab this morning, when she was saluted by Gloster Meteor jet which there were seven, first appeared on the port bow, and flew past at little more than masthead height. Breaking formation astern, the aircraft returned on the starboard side in two groups of three, the remaining machine rounding off the salute by executing a steep climbing turn away from the starboard

Just before two o'clock the America. attended by the tugs Calshot, Wellington, Sloyne, Neptune and Hornby, was berthed in the New Docks, adjacent to a venerable forerunner in the transto a venerable forerunner in the transatlantic service, the Aquitania, other near neighbours being the Stirling Castle and Queen Mary. Those of us who had been on board when the morning could not fail to remember ings had appeared at the French port where the liner Paris, lying burnt-out damaged docks. The America is the first passenger liner sailing in a regular since the interruption of services by the war,

Shortly after the America had made fast, the band of the Southern Railway came to play on the dockside, and a little later the mayor of Southampton, with the deputy-mayor and town clerk, came on board, where they were received by Commodore Henry Manning and officials of the United States Lines. At a reception held in the first-class ballroom, a large number of guests were present. Welcoming the guests, Commodore Manning said he was happy to introduce them to his ship, which he described as "a free-born queen of the seas." He hoped that she would carry thousands of thousands eager to go to the United

HOUSE OF LORDS Friday, Nov. 22, 1946

GENERAL AVERAGE CLAIM MORRISON STEAMSHIP COMPANY, LTD. v. THE OWNERS OF CARGO LATELY LADEN ON BOARD "GREYSTOKE CASTLE"

Before Viscount SIMON, Lord ROCHE, Lord PORTER, Lord SIMONDS and
Lord UTHWATT

Their Lordships dismissed this appeal y the Morrison Steamship Company, Ltd., owners of the steamer Cheldale, against an order of the Court of Appeal dated Dec. 20, 1944, dismissing an appeal by them from an order of Lord Merriman confirming a report of Mr. Registrar Darby in an action arising out of a collision between the Cheldale and the Greystoke Castle (owned by the Lancashire Shipping Company, Ltd.). The Cheldale sank and the Greystoke Castle put into Durban for repairs.

General Average expenditure was there incurred to the amount of £18,061. Owners of cargo on board the *Greystoke Castle*, being debarred by a negligence clause from claiming redress at the hands of the owners of that vessel, issued a writ against the owners of the Cheldale claiming to recover sums paid by them as General Average contributions. Mr. Justice Bucknill held Mr. Justice Bucknill held in litigation between the shipowners that both vessels were to blame for the collision, the Cheldale as to one-quarter and the Greystoke Castle as to three-quarters. The appellants admitted liability for one-fourth of the loss caused by physical damage to cargo but disputed liability in

damage to cargo but disputed liability in respect of General Average,

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JUDGMENT

Viscount Simon said this appeal involved a difficult question of principle relating to general average expenditure—a question on which the House had not previously pronounced and on which previous decisions in the English courts appeared to be in conflict. The opinions of those who heard the appeal were not unanimous but the majority had come to the conclusion that the appeal should be dismissed and that would be the decision of the House. His own reflections had led him to the minority view expressed by Lord Simonds. He understood that their Lordships were at one in rejecting the view of Lord Justice Scott that when the Greystoke Castle claimed to recover General Average expenditure from the Cheldale, which was partly blame for the collision, the Greystoke Castle could only recover the net sum arrived at by deducting the cargo-owners' contribution. He agreed with the rest of their Lordships in that view.

Lord Roche said he was of opinion that the result arrived at in the courts below was correct and the appeal should be dis-

The claim of the respondents, owners congress of the cargo laden in the Greystoke Castle so far as it was in dispute was a claim to be supported by paid direct by the owners of the Cheldale (as having been held one quarter to blame for the collision) one quarter of amount they had paid in general average in respect of port of refuge expenses in-curred by reason of the collision. judgment this reasoning was erroneous. No doubt the principle had been restated in textbooks and on occasion might have been followed but it was disregarded by the Court of Appeal in the Minnetonka tons net.

case in which in his opinion the reasoning Company Meeting

It was contended in the present case that respondents had no right of suit because (a) their cargo sustained no material or physical damage and an expense occa sioned to them after the collision in con nection with a contract was not actionable and (b) that they were really in the same position as underwriters who had no direct cause of action against a wrongdoer. Th latter branch of the contention appeared to him largely a repetition of the argument in the Marpessa case and the supposed remoteness of the expense.

As to the first branch of the contention

he would observe that in his judgment if the expense was occasioned by the collision and if it was the expense in whole or part of the cargo owners then no authority was cited to support the proposi-tion that whether by land or by sea physical or material damage was necessary to support a cause of action in a case like this. He had used the phrase "if the expense is the expense of the cargo owners" and that hypothesis raised the central point in the appellants' contention. The contention rested on the proposition that a cargo owner in a case like the present was in no other or different category from that of an insurer and accordingly could not sue in his own right. An examination of the history of general average and of the leading authorities on the subject negatived this contention and showed that the cargo owner's obligation was a direct obligation to share the expenses incurred by reason of the common danger and acts done to meet it. He was a principal in the transaction.

Another contention for the appellants was that the shipowner incurred the expenses of necessity in order to earn his freight under the contract of affreightment and in no other capacity. Examination of history and of the authorities negatived that contention also and showed that the shipowner through the master had imposed upon him other and super-added duties causing him to act as agent for all the persons whose interests were endangered.

The authorities established the principle which he held to be correct that the obligation of the cargo owners was to share the expenses in the general average act that they were ab initio responsible for their proper share though the responsibility might be divested or diminished by the subsequent chances of the voyage. The expenses accordingly were in due proportion to their expenses and they were not in a position equivalent or even analogous to that of an insurer and the principle of subrogation had no application. For these reasons he would dismiss the appeal. Lord PORTER and Lord UTHWATT con-

Lord SIMONDS dissented. He said the decisive matter was to determine the true nature of the general average contribution. It was a contribution made by the respondents towards the expenditure incurred by the ship arising out of a general average act. That expenditure was incurred by the ship and he could not accept the view that any primary liability was imposed upon the respondents in respect of the items of goods supplied or services rendered which appeared in the general average statement. The master of the ship was no doubt in such an event an agent of necessity for all interests concerned but he was not in respect of general average expenditure the agent for the eargo owner in the sense that the latter was his principal and as such liable for the whole or an aliquot part of the debt due for goods or services. For the whole of such expenditure the ship was liable and the whole of it (subject to any exceptions) the ship could recover from the wrongdoer.

The obligation and the only obligation of the respondents was to their carrying ship and the question was whether the loss which the fulfilment of the obligation imposed was a loss which the law recognised as flowing from the act of the wrongdoer. To say that ship and cargo were engaged in a joint adventure was convenient and apt but it led to no conclusion. The cargo owner made his general average contribution because he was under a contractual or other obligation to do so, not because the master of the ship was his agent or stood in any other relation to him. Therefore the damage suffered by the cargo owner in respect of general average contribution was damage which

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
