FACULTY OF PAINTING AT THE ACADEMY OF FINE ARTS IN GDANSK

History of Faculty of Painting goes back to the very beginning of the Academy, legendary "Sopot School", which founders were mostly painters. Krystyna Łada-Studnicka, Józefa Wnukowa, Hanna Żuławska, Janusz Strzałecki, Juliusz Studnicki, Jacek Żuławski and a sculptor Marian Wnuk. It is worth to mention them here, because they were great artists and personalities, and our professors had pleasant and grateful memory of them.

During sixty years of history of the faculty, among many famous and distinguished artists, connected with the Academy, we can find Aleksander Kobzdej (1947-1951), Stanisław Teisseyre, who worked from 1950 to 1965, Stanisław Michałowski (1950-1953), Stanisław Borysowski, who ran the Painting Studio from 1953. Jan Cybis worked from 1955 to 1957. Piotr Potworowski ran the Studio of Painting after his return from England that is from 1958 to 1962. Teresa Pągowska started her artistic career here. Among many outstanding artists and teachers, whose lives were permanently connected with the history of the Faculty and Academy, Zygmunt Karolak, Rajmund Pietkiewicz, Maksymiliam Kasprowicz, Władysław Jackiewicz, Kazimierz Śramkiewicz, Kazimierz Ostrowski and Jerzy Zabłocki ought to be mentioned. Our latest history consists of recently retired professors: Hugon Lasecki, Włodzimierz Łajming, Kiejstut Bereźnicki, Andrzej Dyakowski.

The history of the Faculty was their own history at the same time. Their students are not only today's teaching staff, educating the next generation of painters, but also the active artists, who create both in Poland and abroad. Looking through the publications, we can observe the role played by the Faculty of Paining in creating the faculty's character. Initially independently, and between 1947 and 1950 it created the structure together with Interior Design. From 1968 to 2007 the Faculty existed and the Faculty of Painting and Graphics. That co-existence had strong impact on the condition of both fields of studies, giving them the full artistic concomitance.

Independence which has been gained defines new goals and new directions for the Faculty to build its new identity, based on great tradition and contemporary attitude to didactic work. Great artists, who made the history of our School with their artistic, uncompromising presence, their dedication to the idea of art, always will be the role models for us, the teaching staff and young students of painting.

Painting, as no other domain of art, can evoke what is not obvious, sometimes elusive and difficult to describe. It seems that contemporary pa-

Painting, as no other domain of art, can evoke what is not obvious, sometimes elusive and difficult to describe. It seems that contemporary painting regains its energy with greater strength, than it was noticed before, despite the publicly announced ends and triumphal returns. That strength is not only in continuality and renewal, as these are obvious. Artists with awareness of tradition (which is a luggage of the past), choosing the journey that is called Art, opens the borders before himself of what was unavailable till now, although it apparently existed so close. A work of art in itself includes the world of truth, and getting to know that world is worth many sacrifices.

The award is getting closer to the secrets that allow you to perceive what seemed to be difficult and complicated. That kind of awareness, which students reach at each level of studies, allows them to be the participants of that world as a recipient and an author. Specific character of the studies at the Faculty of Painting is an attempt to balance that close connection between theory and practice. Above all it is the development of student's personality and understanding his own feelings that are crucial to start independent and responsible artistic work. At last it is a fundamental question concerning the value and sense of creating art in the era of an endless redefinition of art and picture.

The Faculty of Painting trying to meet both its own tradition as well as the contemporary needs halfway, educates the painters, offering its students highly qualified teaching staff. Furthermore, the Faculty has the power to carry out the PhD and habilitation programme, and procedures for awarding the title of professor. The Faculty consists of four chairs: Chair of Basic Education, Chair of Painting, Chair of Drawing and Chair of Specializations (composed of three studios: Mural Painting and Stained Glass, Art of Fibre and Art in the Public Space). The didactical process is based on the individual students' work in a chosen studio. The studios have their own, independent, author's programme, based on teachers' artistic experience and taking into account the specificity of the studio. The studios prepare exhibitions at the end of the semesters and academic years, which present the effects of work for students, teachers, and future candidates.

The current exhibition in Istanbul, organized at the kind invitation of the Faculty of Fine Arts of the Marmara University, is a great opportunity to present works of the artists connected with the Faculty of Painting of the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdansk and the Department of Visual Arts of the Faculty of Architecture of the Gdansk University of Technology. All the artists have something in common: they graduated from Gdansk Academy. We hope that the exchange initiative between the Gdansk and Istanbul academic circles will let us to get acquainted with each others' works and share experiences. Our exhibition at the end of 2010 in Istanbul, the current European Capital of Culture, is both significant and symbolic. The city of Gdansk, famous for its quest for freedom and for making Poland a European country again, is also a candidate for this honorable title. Our country has since become a member of the European Union, a fact that allows us to draw a symbolic parabola as at a certain point in the past the fate of Europe was decided in Istanbul. While looking for our own European identity, it is important to remember the history because without it the European identity seems to be incomplete. Gdansk is a well-known place in Europe, famous for its affection for freedom and culture. We hope to host our friends from the Marmara University in the near future.



JÓZEF CZERNIAWSKI

Born in Myślibórz in 1954. Currently, he is responsible for the Studio of Drawing and Painting of the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk. He lives and works in Sopot. Józef Czerniawski proves that contemporary art can make use of not only photography, film, and conceptual art, but also of painting. The most important source of inspiration for his works are landscapes. His works challenge the image conventions. He uses a variety of materials, such as paint, fabric, paper, artificial fur, sand, which often results in irritating juxtapositions. He oscillates between the concreteness of theme and the aesthetic composition of the "remembered landscapes". He changes via context the importance of certain themes familiar to the public so that a new reception of reality opens up in front of a spectator. Allegories, partly real and partly fictitious, cannot be interpreted unambiguously. Their value depends on the precise impact on the viewer's feelings by means of a somehow optimistic, romantic content.

HENRYK CZEŚNIK

Born in 1951 in Sopot. Painter, illustrator, stage designer, actor, educator. He studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk. In 1977 he graduated from Professor Kazimierz Ostrowski's studio. Currently, he works as a professor at his alma mater - the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk, where he is responsible for the Studio of Painting and the graduates. His works has been displayed in more than a hundred exhibitions around the world. They are collected in such museums as the National Museums in Warsaw, Gdańsk, Moscow, Sofia, Dresden, as well as in many private collections. He has travelled a lot and participated in several national and international open air workshops. He also acted in such films as Sztos in 1997 and Boys don't Cry in 2000.

He has received numerous awards and prizes, among them the following:

ROBERT FLORCZAK


In 1988 he obtained a diploma in Professor Zabłocki's Studio of Painting.

Since 1990 he has worked at the Gdańsk Academy of Fine Arts. Currently, he is an Associate Professor there. He deals in painting, object, performance, stage design, and interiors (interiors of the clubs in New Haven, Warsaw and Sopot). He is the author of stage designs for several performances in the theatres in Gdynia, Gdańsk, Warsaw, Lublin, Grudziądz, and Kalisz. He specializes in performance art, e.g. Varsovia Galopka presented in Rio de Janeiro, Eagles and banners, the faith which was lacking - professorship paintings exhibited in Poland, France, Germany, and the US.

His recent passion: eagles made from war scythe with the use of regimental colours, painted on advertising banners.

ROMAN GAJEWSKI



Born in 1954 in Sopot. Painter, graphic artist, gallery leader, essayist, and sometimes also a poet. A former graduate and now a professor of the Faculty of Painting of the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk, he is the alumnus of Professor Jackiewicz. In 1985-86 he was a visiting student of the Italian government. On numerous occasions he has cooperated with the Sabanci University in Istanbul. He also initiated and founded the Artistic Initiative Association. He co-founded the gallery of the Academy of Fine Arts, "Nowa Oficyna", as well as "Na Wieży" gallery. Additionally, he has organized many group exhibitions in Poland and abroad.

The most important completed projects: Oliwa closer to Gdańsk – Gdańsk closer to Art community manifesto, Inspection of the Scene. Generations., and an international exchange with Kunstation Kleinsassen in Fulda (Germany). He has participated in approximately a hundred exhibitions, both group and individual. He is not interested in any competitive exhibitions.

Since 1985 he has worked on his "endless" series of paintings, THE SHOW MUST GO ON. The cycle constitutes the account of changing times and diversity of situations around us. It is changed by either creating new components or recreating the old ones. At the moment, it comprises approximately 150 images. The project, whose size defies the ability of perception, became a kind of installation which organizes space. The author deals in portrait painting, wall painting, drawing, and computer graphics. Sometimes he is also an organizer or a curator of exhibitions. Since 1988 Piotr Józefowicz has worked at the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk and since 2002 he has been responsible for the Studio of Drawing at the Faculty of Painting. Currently, he is a vice-rector for student affairs and cooperation programs.



He focuses on painting and drawing, creates installations, and carries out several artistic and cultural projects, e.g. the Artistic and Social Event "Be a Conscious Organ Donor" in 2000. From the very beginning he has been an active participant of the 'SFINKS' Foundation in Sopot. His achievements include several individual and numerous group exhibitions. He is interested in the subject of a man in civilization and cultural context. Jacek Kornacki reflects on the phenomenon of passing, displaying traces of the past cultures and civilizations. He derives some motifs from the historical legacy and interprets them - this is how he creates the substance of his art.

DOMINIKA KRECHOWICZ

Dominika Krechowicz was born in Gdańsk in 1964. She studied at the Faculty of Painting and Graphic Art of the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk. In 1988 she obtained a diploma under the supervision of Professor Kazimierz Ostrowski. Since 1996 she has worked in the Department of Visual Arts at the Faculty of Architecture of the Gdansk University of Technology. Since 2000 she has been an Associate Professor there.

From 1995 to 2003 she co-created a programme for the "Koło" Gallery in Gdańsk. She focuses on painting and photography. She has participated in many exhibitions in Poland and abroad (England, Austria, and Germany). In 1997 Dominika Krechowicz received a bronze medal in the 33rd National Competition of Contemporary Painting, Bielska Jesień [Autumn in Bielsko]. In 2002 she received the Scholarship of the Marshall of Pomerania Province. In 2006 she also wan a Scholarship of the Pollock-Krasner Foundation.

HANNA NOWICKA-GROCHAL



JAKUB PIELESZEK


MARIUSZ WARAS












JACEK ZDYBEL
